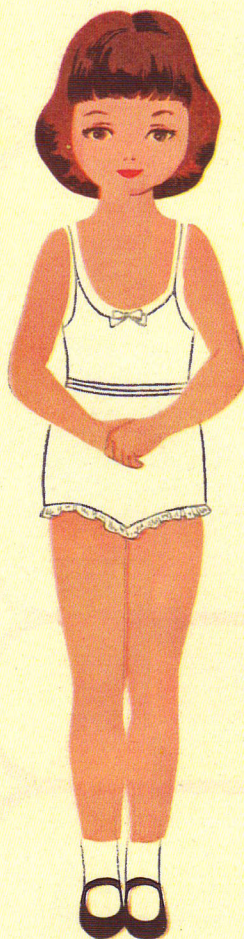

"Betsy," said Mother, "I can't understand it. I baked a big cherry pie for Washington's birthday and a little one for you—and the little pie has completely disappeared!"



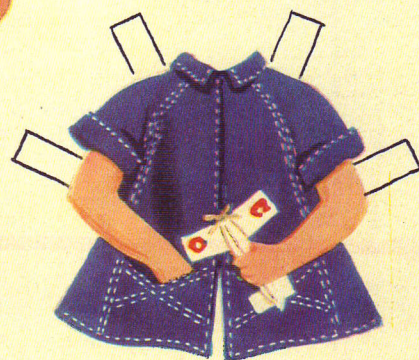

Betsy McCall has her very own plate and Romance silverware



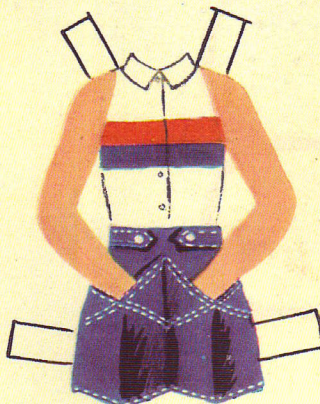
Betsy's blue jacket goes with her shorts, pedal pushers and sun dress



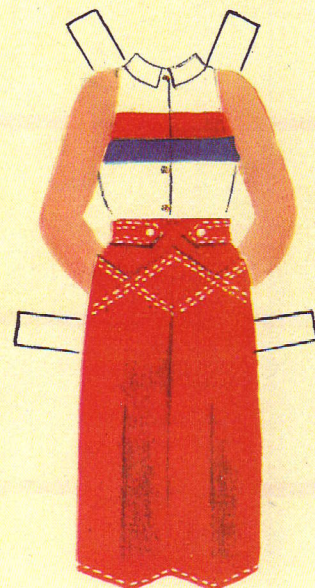
Betsy McCall's sun dress has great big pockets and white stitching
